Serif fonts like Georgia and Times have "feet" coming out from the ends of vertical strokes. These feet are the serifs.

Pronunciation: 'Serif' rhymes with 'sheriff'.

Sans serif fonts like
Myriad Pro do not have
these feet. "Sans" is a
French word for
"without" so it literally
means "without serif".
Though they are
associated with
modern typography,
sans serif fonts date
from the 1810s.

Pronunciation: 'Sans' rhymes with 'hands'.
