7 Common Navigation Techniques

- Tooltips

Linked Images

Allow you to turn any picture into a hyperlink.

1. Set up your hyperlink element

```
<a href="https://giphy.com/"></a>
```

Put an image element between the opening and closing tags. I

```
<a href="https://giphy.com/"><img src="https://media1.giphy.com/media/3o72F241sDzoHEWCzu/200w.gif" /></a>
```





Opening tag of link

Closing tag of link

Bookmarks

Mouse Over

Tooltips

Change an image or button when you move the user has their mouse over it (helps provide user feedback).

Mouse Over



(Oldschool) Image Rollover Technique (no CSS):

Notes: This technique works best with small images and when the two images are the same size. The other problem is that if the images are too big there will be "lag" when you are switching between them.

Tooltips

On mouse-over, displays a short message next to the mouse after hovering for a short time. Great to provide extra information on links or images and can provide user feedback (so that the user knows the item they are on is active)



For any element in your HTML, simply add a title attribute.

Bookmarks

(formerly called anchor links)

Allow you to jump to a different position on a page.

1. Add a unique id to any HTML element you want to jump to:

```
<h1 id="top-info">Info About Us</h1>
```

Back to Top ----

Create a hyperlink somewhere
 on your page (such as a navigation bar)
 and add an href link to that ID:

```
<div class="container">...
</div>
<div class="container">...
</div>
<div class="container">...</div></div>
```

Back to top

</div>

HTML5 Navigation Div

A simple way to add navigation on your pages. Limited control of style and position.

 Use the <nav> element in HTML5, simply place a list of links inside that div. You can style the links in whatever way you want in your CSS.

CSS Navigation Bar

Use CSS to create and style your navigation bars.

- ✓ Gives you a lot of control over the style and behaviour of the buttons.
- ✓ CSS makes it easier to copy between pages and update the style as needed.
