

Analyzing Professional Websites



Common Layout Trends? What did we notice?

- 5. Majority of important content in the center of the screen
- 6. Often includes eye-catching photos on the homepage
- 7. Often includes a gallery or slideshow on the homepage
- 8. Scroll down to view more content

Responsive Design


Websites often change dynamically when the size of the screen changes. Resize your website's window and see what happens!



Layout - Rule of Thirds

Structure your page into 9 regions (a 3-by-3 grid)

The "hotspots" tend to be the 4 intersection points of the 9 regions. Key information or visuals should be placed on these points.







Layout - Grid System

When designing your layout, consider HORIZONTAL and VERTICAL alignment as if things on your page were locked to a grid.

Alignment gives **structure** to the website.

Ask: "If I broke things into a grid, would they line up in an organized and appealing way?"











Layout - Grid System

The 960 Grid system is a design framework that proposes:

- that all websites should fit a width of 960 pixels for content (it fits all types of displays nicely both modern and old screens)
- that the content should be divided into 12, 16, or 24 columns.
- That you consistently use these columns to structure your website but you can decide how information spreads across the columns.



Rule of Thirds + Grid Layout

As you can see, you can come up with many different styles for the same content while still following rule of thirds and grid layout as rough guidelines.
